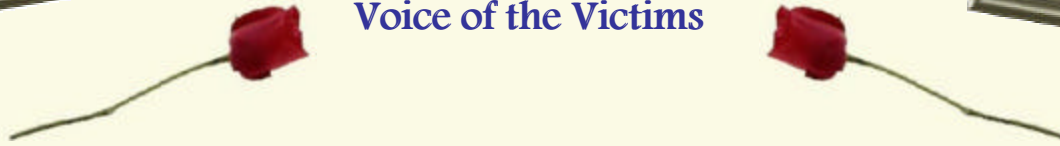


# *Cathy's Prom*
